1.<u>Business Insider: 3 Democratic</u> <u>lawmakers want to give parents \$393 a</u> <u>month per kid for 18 years</u>

On Thursday, Reps. Ilhan Omar, Rashida Tlaib, and Chuy Garcia reintroduced the End Child Poverty Act, which would create a universal benefit giving families \$393 a month per child until the child turns 18.

2.<u>Axios: COVID-19 Played A Role In U.S.'s Increasing Maternal Morality Rate</u>

The U.S. maternal mortality rate increased during the COVID-19 pandemic, disproportionately impacting Black women, with far higher odds of severe complications among pregnant patients with COVID infection

at delivery, a new analysis published in JAMA Network Open found.

3.<u>Salon: Infant formula shortage often led to alternative, less-healthy means of nourishment</u>

One-third of families who relied on formula were forced by severe shortages to resort to suboptimal feeding methods.
