According to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, "1-in-5 children ages 3 to 17 in the United States has a mental, emotional, behavioral, or developmental disorder."

That's 20 percent of all children!

And the **Children's Mental Health Network** reports that 80% of chronic mental disorders begin in childhood.

In addition, "suicide is the second leading cause of death for children, adolescents and young adults age 15-to-24 year olds." **The American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry** says, "The majority...who attempt suicide have a significant mental health disorder, usually depression."

September is Suicide Prevention Month and First 5 Marin is teaming up with local mental health professionals and local service providers to focus on this

issue.
